INDIAN PREFERENCE POLICY: Preference in filling vacancies is given to qualified Indian candidates in accordance with the Indian Preference Act of 1934 (Title 25, USC, Section 472). Verification Form BIA-4432 must be submitted with the application if claiming Indian Preference. Indian preference eligible that are not currently employed in the Federal Service will be appointed under the Excepted Service Appointment Authority (Schedule A). Consideration will be given to Non-Indian applicants (status or reinstatable) in the absence of qualified Indian Preference eligible.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYER: Within the scope of Indian preference, all candidates will receive consideration without regard to race, color, sex, age, religion, sexual orientation, national origin or other non-merit factors.

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION LANGUAGE: This agency provides reasonable accommodation to applicants with disabilities. STATEMENT OF DUTIES:

Organize, implement and evaluate an innovative, coordinated home living program to be conducted in a dormitory on a seven day week, 24 hour daily basis. The program will incorporate educational, psychological, sociological and physiological aspects of human development in order to insure the academic, personal and social development of boarding students who are separated from their families, are of a minority culture, and may have been reared in geographically isolated areas. Prepares and presents quarterly Narrative Residential Reports to the Assistant Principal (Student Supports) informing him/her of the progress, problems, strengths and weaknesses of each program and project within the Residential Department. Responsible for supervising paraprofessional staff in the dormitory. Cooperates with and assists the Assistant Principal (Student Supports) in determining the assignment, workload, evaluation, transfer, or dismissal of staff members. Develops and implements annual staff training and an in-service training program which will foster the professional growth and development of staff members through opportunities for visitation, demonstrations, conferences, workshops, training sessions and research projects. Assist staff with improving their performance, and ensures development of Individual Development Plans (IDP) for each staff member. Conduct fire, safety and accountability drills and maintain the safety of the children according to school policies, Bureau of Indian Education policies and Oregon School Laws. Experience in residential living programs, recreation, wrap around services and positive behavior support programs is highly desirable.

Applicants will have successfully completed a full course of study in an accredited college or university leading to a bachelor's or higher degree which includes or is supplemented by a minimum 24 semester hours in education, counseling, or psychology, of which 12 semester hours will be in guidance, counseling or psychology courses directly related to education.

PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS:

Qualifying experience will be in school administration, teaching, counseling, residential programs or professional education experience.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Good distant vision in one eye and ability to read without strain printed material the size of typewritten characters are required, glasses permitted. Ability to hear the conversational voice, with or without a hearing aid, is required; in most instances and, amputation of arm, hand, leg or foot will not disqualify an applicant for appointment, although it may be necessary that this condition be compensated by satisfactory prosthesis. In addition applicant must possess mental and emotional stability. The positions require normal physical activity, field travel, and attendance at meetings and conference away from the duty station. A valid Driver's License and compliance with all driver policies is required to perform these duties.

BASIS OF RATING:

All applicants for this position will be rated and ranked based upon the extent and quality of their experience, training and/or education as reflected on the application. Applicants will be further evaluated according to the degree to which they possess or have the potential to acquire knowledge, skills, abilities, and personal characteristics as listed below. The judgment of qualifications will be based on the material submitted; therefore, it is to the applicant's advantage to give complete and thorough responses and to present information in a neat and orderly fashion. Qualifications and veteran's preference eligibility will be determined on the basis of information submitted.

SUITABILITY & CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS:

A background security investigation is required. Appointment is subject to the successful completion of the security investigation and favorable adjudication. Failure to meet these requirements will be grounds for termination

SPECIAL REFERENCE:

- You must be a U.S. citizen to qualify for this position.
- Applicant is subject to a favorable background investigation. Upon selection, selectee will be required to complete a Declaration for Federal Employment, OF-306. This is a Non-Critical, Moderate Risk Position subject to a favorable adjudicated background investigation.
- A Pre-Employment Physical Examination will be required.
- Subject to probationary period for 3 years, which may be extended.
- The incumbent is required to drive a motor vehicle to conduct business at field locations. A valid State driver's license is required. 1. *Applicants may file a resume or any other written format of the applicant's choice. **MUST CONTAIN:** Vacancy Announcement No., Job Title, Duties and accomplishments, Employer's name and address, supervisors name and phone number, starting and ending dates (month and year), hours per week, and salary. Complete names and telephone numbers of Employer references (must be within the past 5 years) and three (3) personal references. List people who are not related to you and who know you well on a personal basis and know your qualifications and fitness for the kind of job for which you applying.
2. *College Transcript is required for verification/documentation and for pay purposes (If selected, applicant must provide Official College Transcripts, if applicable)
3. *Copy of Valid State Driver's License.
4. Form BIA 4432, Verification of Indian Preference for Employment, is required for claiming Indian Preference. The form must be completed by the appropriate official with the federally-recognized tribe where the applicant is enrolled as a member. No other form will be accepted.
5. Copy of most recent SF-50, Notification of Personnel Action, current or former Federal employees.
6. Applicant Screening Questionnaire, Indian Child Protection Requirement Form, must contain original signature and date. This position is covered by P.L. 101-647, Indian Children Protection Requirements, and persons convicted of crimes enumerated in the law are not eligible for the position. Optional during the application process; however, selectees will be required to submit as part of the pre-appointment process.

Notification Requirements
